¹ A central theme of genuine faith vs. bogus faith is suggested by the triply repeated mention of self-deception: 1:16; 1:22; 1:26. ² Of the 4 men named James in the NT only the last of these is almost certainly the author of this letter: Judas' Dad (Luke 6:16); Zeb's son (Acts 12:2); Alphaeus' son (Mark 3:18); and the (half) brother of Jesus (Galatians 1:19) who was a skeptic (John 7:5) turned Christian leader (1 Corinthians 15:7; Acts 21:18) – the most prominent James in the early church.
